
An Israeli Special Forces Commander On The Front Line Of Counterterrorism

The Changing Nature Of Terrorism


The Importance Of International Cooperation

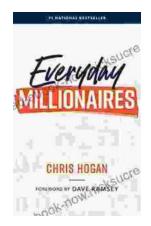
