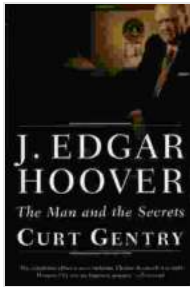


# Edgar Hoover: The Man and the Secrets

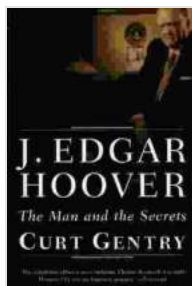
