Conrad Hilton



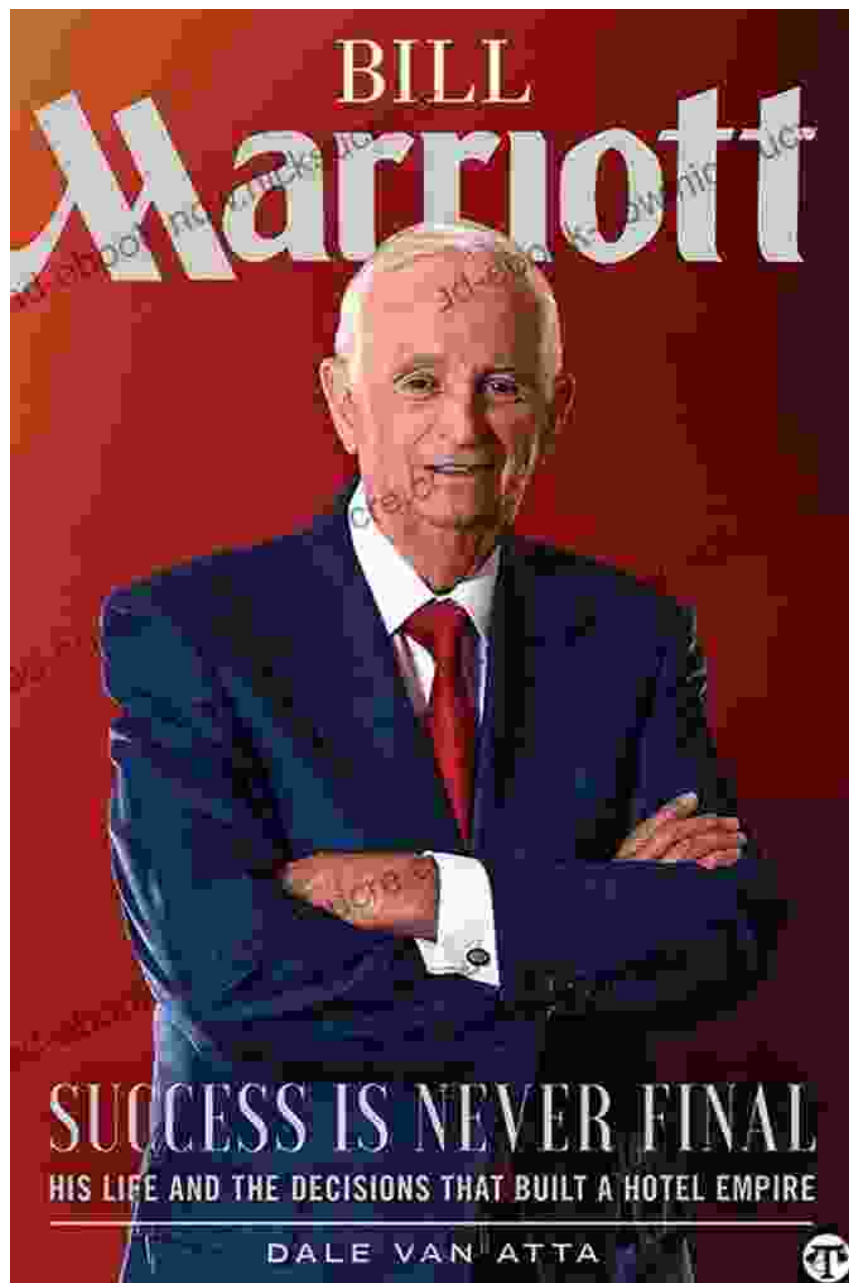

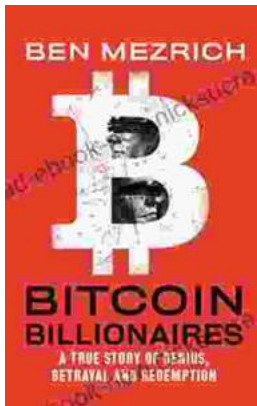
