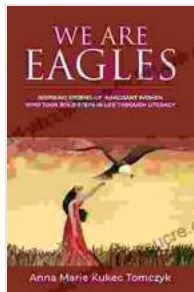

Nooyi's story is an inspiring example of how hard work and determination can lead to success. She has shown that women can achieve anything they set their minds to.

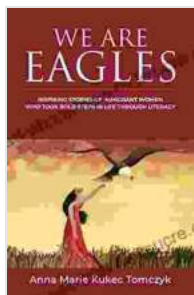
Elizabeth Acevedo
