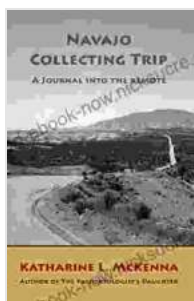


Into the Remote: A Navajo Collecting Trip Journal

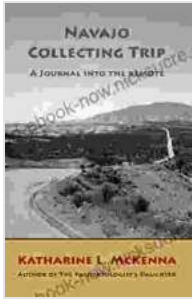

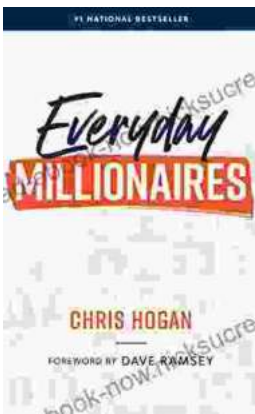

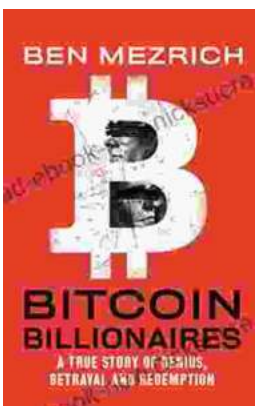
