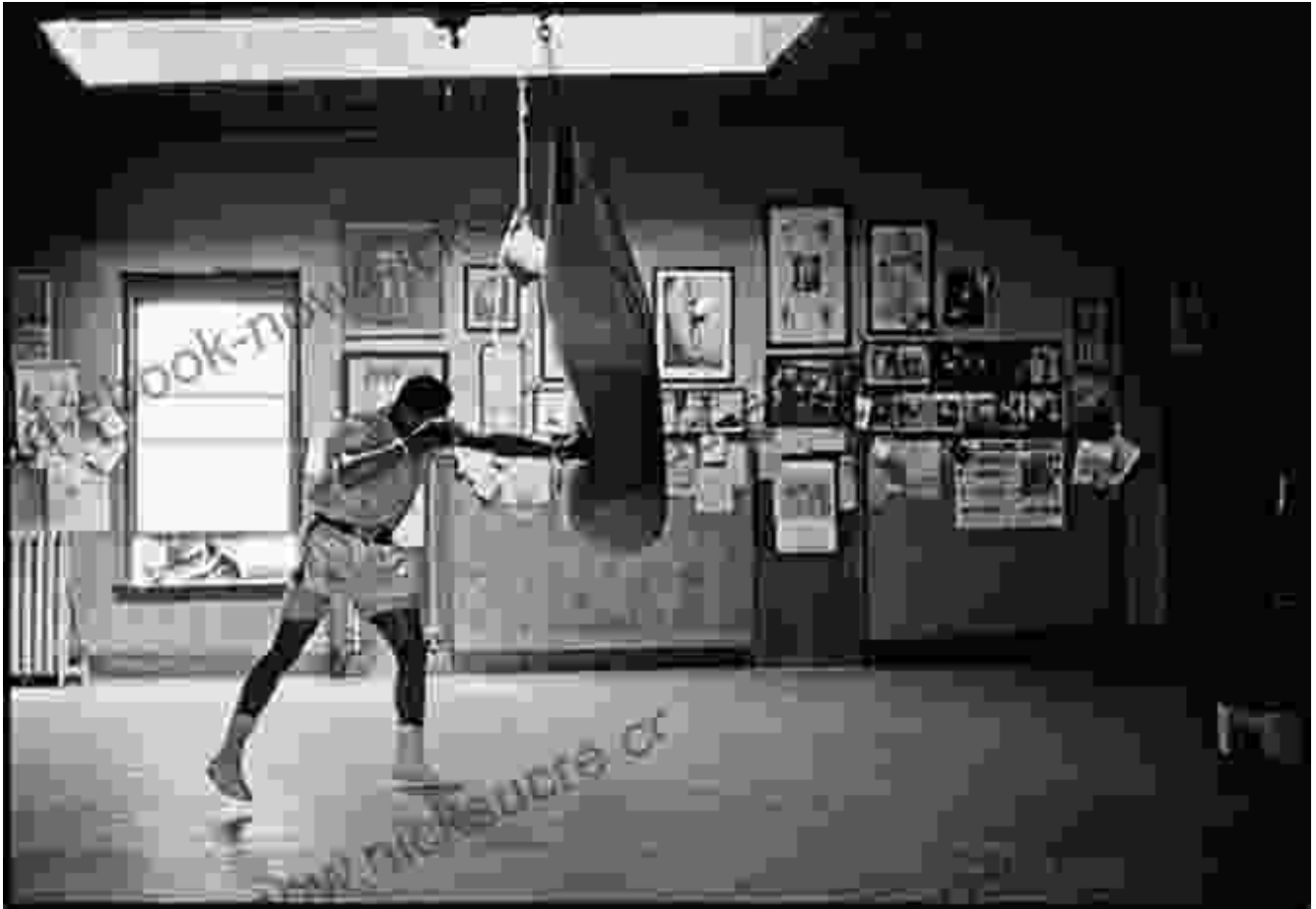

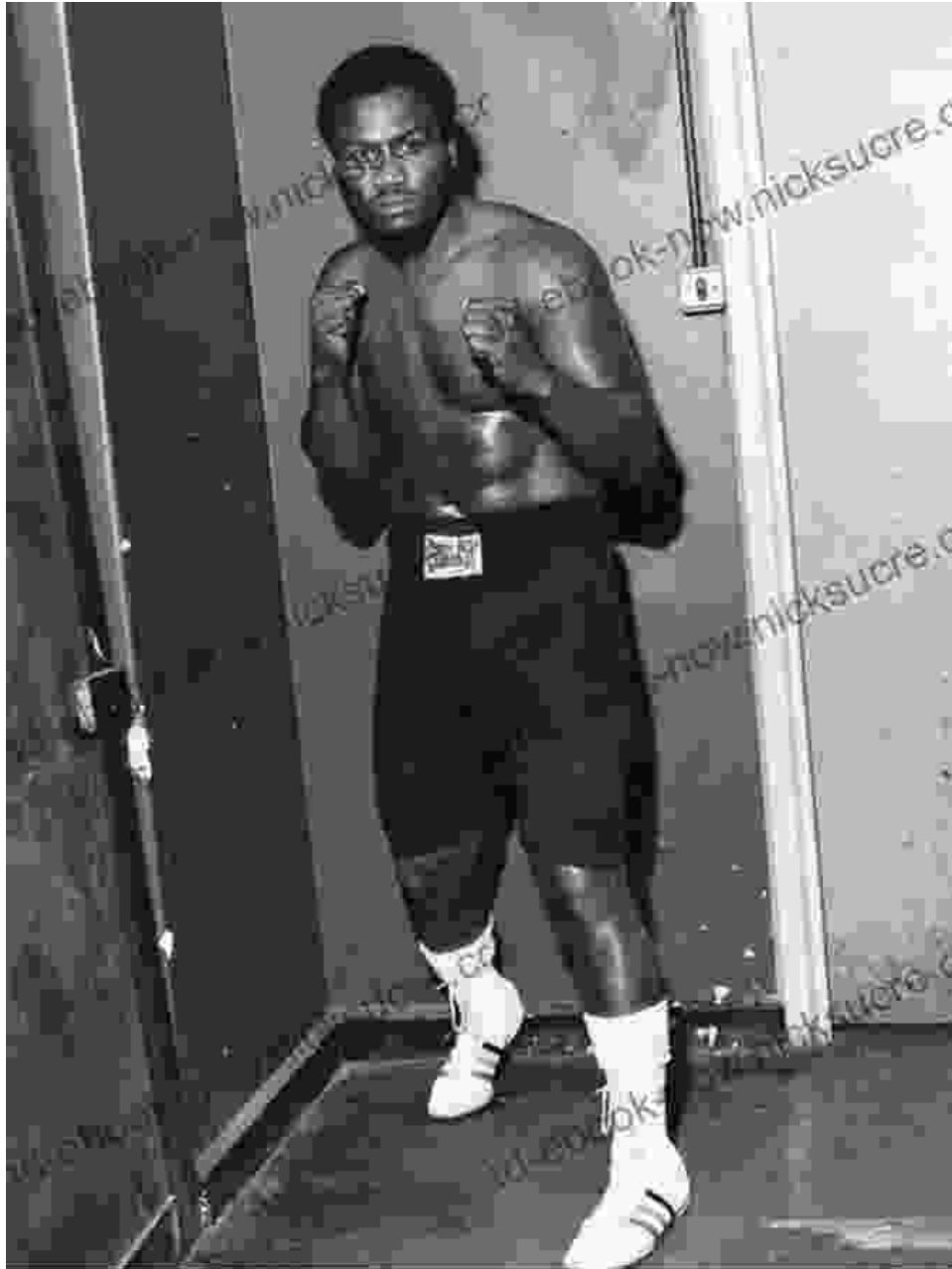


The Early Years

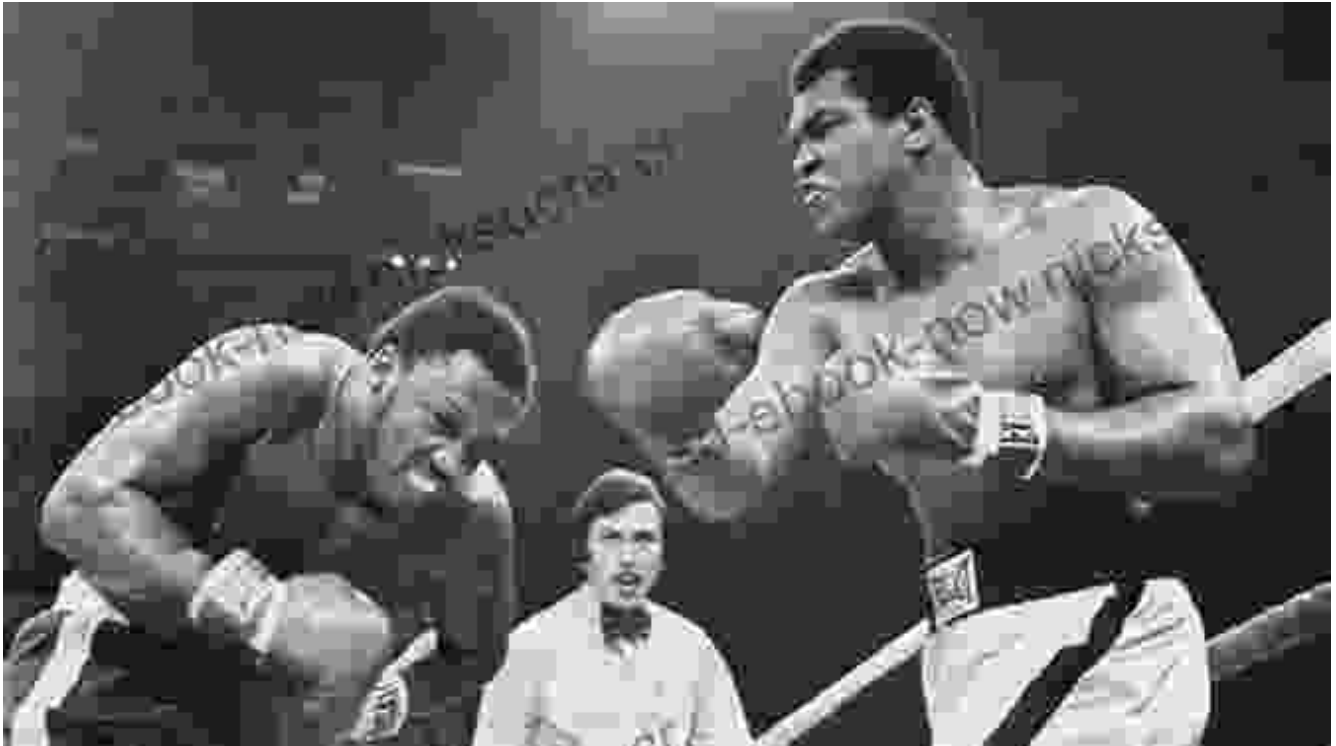

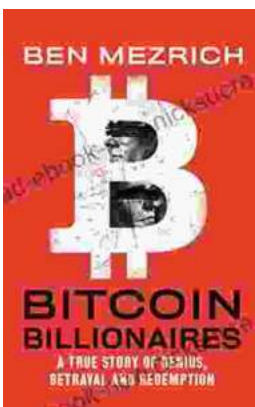
