Marine Corps Women's Reserve was established, and women were allowed to serve in a variety of non-combat roles, including as drivers, mechanics, and communications specialists.

During the Vietnam War, women served in a variety of support roles, but they were not allowed to serve in combat. In 1993, the Department of Defense lifted the ban on women serving in combat roles, but the Marine Corps did not immediately implement the change.

In 2013, the Marine Corps finally opened all combat roles to women. This decision was met with some controversy, but it was ultimately supported by the Commandant of the Marine Corps, General James Amos.

Today, women serve in all combat roles in the Marine Corps, and they have proven to be just as capable as their male counterparts.


